# REGULAR MEETINGS NOW START AT 2 p.m.

The meetings of March were well attended and enjoyable. The first meeting had many of the members discussing the various projects coming up, as well as NEVPEX '86. It took almost all of the meeting time to cover the subjects that were presented.

In the board meeting that preceded the regular meeting, it was noted that NSSS now has \$809.76 in its treasury and \$4500 paid on the new frames. In the discussion, Gus stated that members providing money for the frames will receive notes from NSSS to back their loan. The board approved an auction which will be held on May 24th. Roland Kriel and Bill Brew will handle it. NEVPEX '86 is moving along with 20 dealers already signed up. Exhibitors are applying and with the same prizes as last year there should be a good showing. We do need club members to participate. Dick Dreiling asked if NSSS would be interested in taking a booth at the Navy Air Base in Fallon on April 26, in conjunction with the 75th anniversary of Navy Air Aviation. ### Virgin Islands

The Virgin Islands is a group of islands in the West Indies, southeast of Puerto Rico. The western portion was under the rule of Denmark until 1917 and it is now under the control of the United States. The 30 eastern islands, which comprise the British Virgin Islands, were under Dutch control until 1666, when they passed it to Britain. Until 1956 they were administered as part of the Leeward Islands as a colony. In 1956, the British Virgin Islands bacame a separtate crown colony and in 1967 became an Associated State, with Britain retaining control of foreign affairs and defense.

The map on the following page gives an idea of the part owned by each. However, the map coveres more of the British side and a detailed map of the second largest island, Virgin Gorda.

There are about 30 islands of various sizes, from rocks sticking out of the water to inhabitable pieces of land. Totola is the location of the capital, which is Road Town. The area is 59 sq. miles. The currency was sterling until 1951-2, then 100 cents equaled 1 B.W.I.dollar. In 1962, 100 cents was changed to equal 1 U.S. dollar.

The first stamps of the British Virgin Islands were printed in the St. Ursula design and were issued in 1866. Like St. Lucia and other colonies, who had not been issued stamps with their name or design on them, Great Britain issued a set value amount of the British postage stamps. These were then cancelled with an assigned number. The stamps that were used for overseas mail from the island, which was the captial location, were cancelled with the number 'A 13'.

In 1890 B.V.I. stamps were combined with the Leeward Islands postage issues. Then, in 1899, the British Virgin Islands were given their own set of issues, with the Leeward Islands remaining in use concurrently until 1956. That will be another story in a later issue of Post-Boy.

If this area creates an interest in you, as a new adventure, the address of the Post Office is as follows:

They deal with individual orders for mint, CTAs, FDCs, special postmarks. The agency supplies envelopes. Standing order delivery is available with a minimum deposit in U.S. funds. It was \$8.00. That may have changed by now. Orders will be shipped postfree via surface mail, with extra charges for airmail. Extra handling charges are applied for cancelling covers, only on large quantities of stamps to be affixed to the envelopes. CBC, IMO, and BPO are accepted.


The above information for the British Virgin Islands was brought about by picking up a map of the islands. As I found more information about the island, especially, the postal service that can be obtained, I wondered if this would be of interest to you members in developing your collection. There are various countries that provide this service and their addresses are generally available in the various magaiznes and papers. Not only would you be assured of receiving the latest stamps as they are issued, but the covers that the stamps are shipped in are generally beautiful in design and provide a source of cancelled issues.

I understand that not all of the countries are providing the best of service and maybe your letters are received in various degrees of condition, but after a few tries, a person can learn which countries are good and which are bad. The ones that do not provide a good service, their stamps can be obtained from a new issue service.





New location for April 26, 1986 meeting

The celebration will consist of the Air Station being open to the general public at the invitation of the Commanding Officer. There will be an aircraft static display, an antique automobile display, various military displays including the Nevada National Guard, and the various recruiters from each of the Armed Forces. There will be game and concession booths, live entertainment, and a carnival atmosphere.



This will not only allow all of our members to have an opportunity to view the festivities, but we will also be exposing the general public to the fact that there is a very active stamp club in the local area!! In addition to the all day festivities, there will be a Formal Dinner-Dance called the "Spring Fling" that evening. No Host Cocktails will be at 6:30 p.m. with dinner served at 7:30 p.m.. Dinner will consist of choice of Roast Beef or Chicken Neptune. Music for your dancing pleasure will be provided by the Navy Band from Treasure Island, California. The Spring Fling will also be open to the public, but tickets must be purchased in advance. Tickets will cost \$10.00 per person.
