Prepare any items, maximum of 8 lots, that you have and would like to sell. Place them on Auction Sheets which you can pick up at our next meeting, identify them and show a minimum bid if any. Check them into Ruthe who will assign numbers for them and then they will be put on display so that members can view them before the sale. 10% of the total sale price of member owned items will be retained by the club, the remaining 90% will be paid to you by check, when the sale is over. In the event you make purchases yourself, you will be asked to pay for them in full, as you will receive your proceeds in the form of a check for bookkeeping purposes. We will **not** be able to deduct your purchases from your share of the sales. In the event you have additional items that you wish to **DONATE** to the club with 100% of the purchase price going to the club, we will be happy to accept them, with no limit on the number you may donate. If time does not allow us to sell all of the donated items, we will carry them over for future meetings. Let's make this the best **PHILATELIC AUCTION** we have ever had.

The next thing on our calendar, which we hope everyone will become an active part of, is our annual **CHRISTMAS PARTY**. Again, members, bear with me so that I can explain it to our new members. Each year, **NSSS** has a "**POT LUCK DINNER**" **Christmas** Party for members, and family and friends. Yes you may invite your family to attend with you, or special friends.

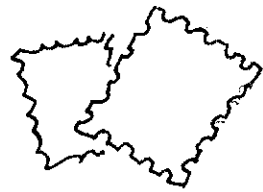
