

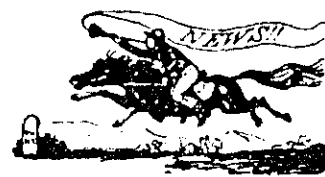

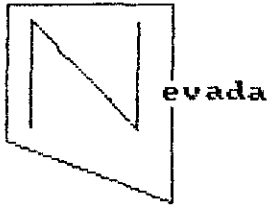

I realize that this is somewhat of a departure for me as I don't usually submit a "Notes from the President". However, I feel that it is time I made a few comments for what they are worth.

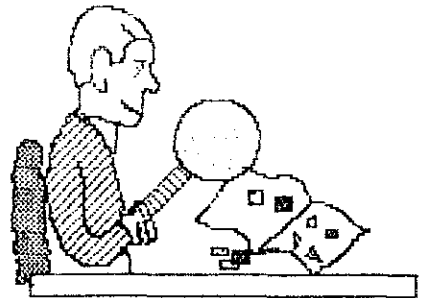
