"trading sessions" held by some clubs - since our collecting interests so vary - trading is difficult - buying isn't.

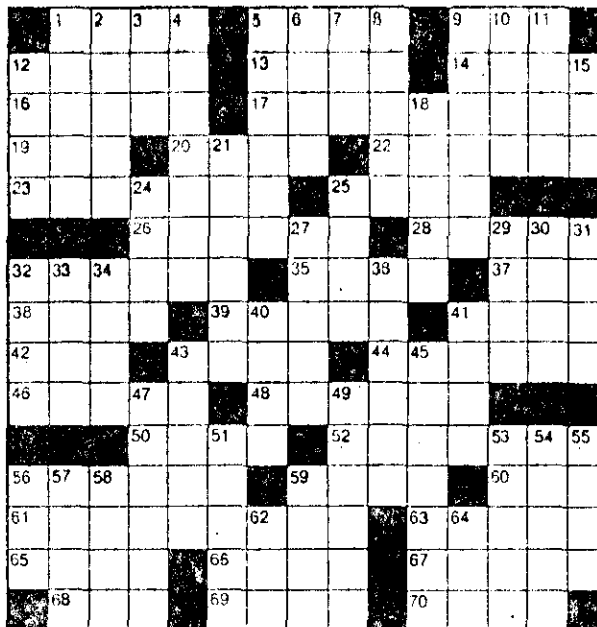

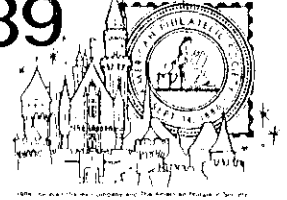

STaMpsHOW Preregistration Available

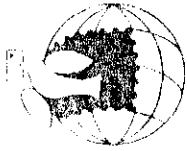
State College, PA, March 31, 1989 --
