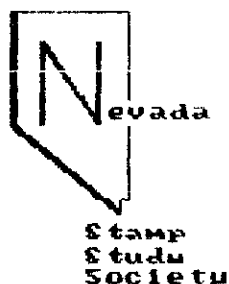

A Few Comments On The NSSF

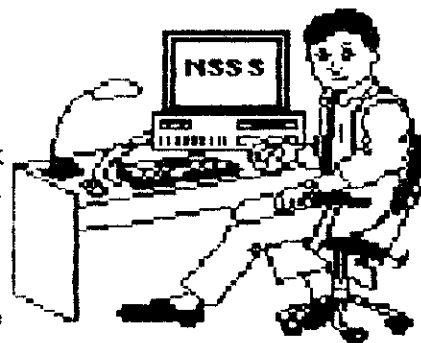


As I approach the end of my term as your President, I would like to express a few of my thoughts and ideas.

The Nevada Stamp Study Society, NSSF, is supposed to be YOUR society. It is to provide you with information and assistance in furthering your collection. The Society is not to become a "one-man (or woman)" operation. The Society is governed by a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and a minimum of three members of the Board of Directors. This does not mean these are the only members that should attend meetings or help out with the various club functions.

The Board of Directors meets, usually, once a month just before a regular club meeting. Board meetings are open to the general membership of the club. All members may speak and bring up topics to be discussed by the Board, but only Board members may actually vote. If you are in anyway dissatisfied with what the club is doing, or you would like to know what direction the club is heading, I would like to encourage you to attend a Board meeting. Our meetings are informal, and since they usually start around 12:00 or 12:30, many of us bring sandwiches, etc., and eat our lunch during the meeting.

One of my biggest disappointments, during my term of office, has been the lack of attendance at meetings and other general functions of the club. About Your Hosts

The Nevada Stamp Study Society (NSSS) was founded in August, 1975 by a group of stamp collectors in Carson City (about 30 miles south of Reno). The charter membership consisted of approximately 10 members. The club met in the (then) Ormsby County Library in Carson City.

Their first stamp exhibition, The NSSS Spring Exhibition, was held May 21-22, 1976 in a small meeting room of the library. The Carson City postmaster, William Dunfield, volunteered his time and set up an exhibition "philatelic station". William Oliver and Barbara DeViolini were invited as judges.

In 1977 & 1978, the Spring Exhibition was held in the Carson City Community Center.

During 1979, the NSSS moved to Reno as the majority of the membership lived there. The 1979 exhibition was called, for the first time, NEVPEX. NEVPEX '79 was held in the Reno-Sparks Convention Center, four miles south of the center of town. The third week in June was decided on as the permanent dates for NEVPEX.

In 1981, NEVPEX hosted the national convention of the American First Day Cover Society. For the first time, the Pioneer Theater-Auditorium was selected as the site for the show. The USPS conducted the first day ceremony for the Wildlife Habitats Block to open the show.

In 1983, NEVPEX was the host for the national convention of the Universal Ship Cancellation Society.

NEVPEX '84 was another routine show.

In 1985, for the first time since moving to Reno, NEVPEX changed it's name. Since the NSSS was hosting the national convention of the American Topical Association, the exhibition was known as NEVPEX-TOPEX '85. To honor the ATA convention, Reno was selected as the first day city for the Ambulance and Buckboard coil stamps of the popular Transportation Series.

Due to a scheduling problem, NEVPEX '86 was forced to move to Bally's Grand.

NEVPEX '87 returned to the Pioneer Theater.

NEVPEX '88 was delighted to be hosts for the 30th Spring Meeting of the American Philatelic Society. NEVPEX was a World Series of Philately Champion of Champions qualifying show for that year.

The Nevada Stamp Study Society is the only non-California member of the Council of Northern California Philatelic Societies. In fact, the Council amended their by-laws to permit us to affiliate with them!

The Nevada Stamp Study Society only has about 50 members. We certainly aren't the largest club in the country, but I'll bet you'll find we are one of the friendliest. The NSSS meets on the second and fourth Saturday of each month at 2:00 p.m.. Meetings are held in Room 209 of the Physics Building at the University of Nevada at Reno (UNR). 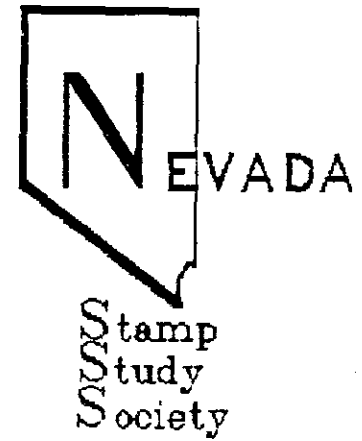
