

THE LOVE STAMP by Joan Fleming

This tale may be of special interest to stamp collectors, nonetheless it is heartwarming to all those who still harbor a trace of romanticism, unscathed by the modern trend of unhappy endings.

It all happened in 1918 when the Swedish Post Office ran short of stamps. The Government authorized the overprinting of old twenty five ore issues to make them valid for twelve ore local postage. During the overprinting, a single sheet of thirty old stamps went into the press upside down, thereby making the overprint seem inverted in relation to the basic stamps.

Errors in most circles are frowned upon, but, as any stamp collector

will tell you, mistakes in the world of philately are eagerly sought. When this Swedish error was revealed, philatelists instantly attempted to buy up the thirty "rare" stamps only to discover that the entire sheet had been purchased

by a young lumberjack who had gone to the north of Sweden on a job. Finally, the lumberjack was traced through a paper company. He was found, but no longer had any of the stamps left. He had used all thirty on daily letters to his sweetheart far to

the South.

Hordes of collectors then rushed to find the girl. Fortunately, the young woman was not only affectionate but well organized. She had not only the love letters, but the envelopes as well. The rare stamps were recovered - all thirty of them - and the young couple was made prosperous by a large payment of 6,000 kroper for the stamps.

ix thousand kroner was equal to three years wages at that time, so the lovers were able to marry at once and buy a home with their unexpected wealth.

Thus it was that 30 small stamps brought happiness to a pair of lovers. Appropriately enough, these Swedish stamps are called "LOVE STAMPS" by collectors.



On 29 November 1960, Japan released a single stand that honored SHIRASE NOBU and the First Japanese Antarctic Expedition along with a commemorative datestamp. Simple enough, find out who SHIRASE NOBU was and find out what all the design elements in the stamp design stood for.

The design consists of a portrait of SHIRADE NORT, a map of Antartctica and a flag showing the Southern Cross. Directly terow the flag is a group of four characters reading YAMATO SNOWFIELD. By 21 July 1960 there were four design essays ready for consideration. (1) the aurora and the Southern Cross flag (2) SHIRASE NOBU and a map of Antarctica (3) icebergs and penguins and (4) the Yamato Snowfield and Dach Patrol. The final design used design two with the addition of the Southern Cross flag from design one. On 26 July it was decided to add the English words FIRST JAPANESE ANTARCTIC EXPEDITION.

On 2 September 1960 the Printing Bureau submitted four trail color proofs of the revised design as shown in the following chart.

ANTARCTIC MAP
pale red brown
bright greenish blue
bright greenish blue
bright blue

FLAG AND SHIRASE black dark brown deep blue dark brown violet

Only the last of these proof colors had any color similar to the colors of the actual Southern Cross flag that had a purple field, red lines and white stars. The stamp representaion of the flag was so small that regardless of the colors used it would have been unnoticeable so the officials decided to use the dullest colors possible, a pale red brown and a black.

On 2 September 1960, the Postal Ministry announced that the stamp would be released on 28 November 1960. On 17 September 1960 officials obtained a copy of the 1913 report of the expedition and learned that its actual departure date was 29 November. This information was sent to regional offices of the Postal Services along with an announcement that the issuance date was therefore being changed to 29 November, but the general public was not notified of the change until mid-Novemebr.

On 29 Novemebr 1960, an official ceremnony was held at Konure, Akita which was the birthplace of SHIRASE NOBU. Among the dignaturies present was Postal Services Minister SUZUKI ZENKO, the president of the Society to Honor SHIRASE NOBU and SHIRASE's son TAKESHI.
