You asked for a list of jobs that need chairman and workers.

- 1. You need a Air Race Chairman and coordinator. The individual will meet 4 or 5 times a year with Mary Byars, Air Race Chairman for the Consession Committee of the National Championship Air Races.
- 2. Design Air Race cancellation and deliverate USPS 90 days before the race. Also request the USPS to come to Air Races and bring the mobile unit.
- 3. Design Cachet for NSSS Cover and take to the printer 60 days before the races.
- 4. Design rubber stamp cachet for post cards, take to Nevada Rubber Stamp 14 days before the races.

- 7. Mount pins and post cards on board.
- 8. buy theft insurance on pins.
- 9. Reserve rental truck 60 days prior to set up day. Truck has to be returned Sunday night.

## Solution

(Puzzle on page 50)

The answer, simply put, is \$29 (X = 29¢).

This puzzle can be solved either by using the principles of algebra or by repeated guessing and re-figuring.


If you are dusting off your algebra equations, we know from the puzzie that 4X plus 96Y is the same as 12X plus 38Y (\$5). Therefore, by grouping the variables (remember, positive becomes negative when it crosses the equal sign) the equation now reads 96Y - 38Y = 12X - 4X.

Therefore, 58Y = 8X. Simplified, 29Y = 4X.

Because 29Y is the same as 4X, it can be substituted in the original equation, making it 29Y plus 96Y = \$5.00 (500), or 125Y = 500.

It is a simple task to divide 500 by 125, leaving 4. Y is equal to 4. Now that we know Y is 4, it is easy to figure the rest.
