The meeting adjourned at 3:45 P.M.

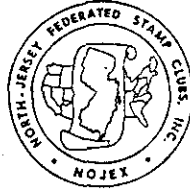

This story first appeared in the United States Mail and Post Office Assistant, No. 57, of June 1865. A newly appointed postmaster in Fulton County, Ills. read his instructions, found he had to send a "quarterly report" and mailed the following.

mr. james Buckanin president of united States

Deer sir Been required by the instructions of the post Office to report quarterly i know herewith foolfil that pleasin duty by reportin as follows:

The Harvestin has been goin on peertly and most of the nabors have got their cuttin about dun wheat is hardly a average crop on rollin lands corn is yallerish and and won't turn out more than ten or fifteen booshills to the aker the health of the commonety is only tolerabil meezils havin brokin out about 2 and a half miles from here thair is a powerful awakenin on the subjic of religun in the Potts naborhood and many soals are bein Made to know their sins forgivin miss nancy Smith a neer nabor had twins day before yesterday. One of them is supposed to be a seven monthser is a poor scraggy thing and wont live half its day this is about all i have the present qr give my rspts to mrs Buckanin and subscribe myself
