Ron was auctioneer with 30 lots posted and 16 were sold.

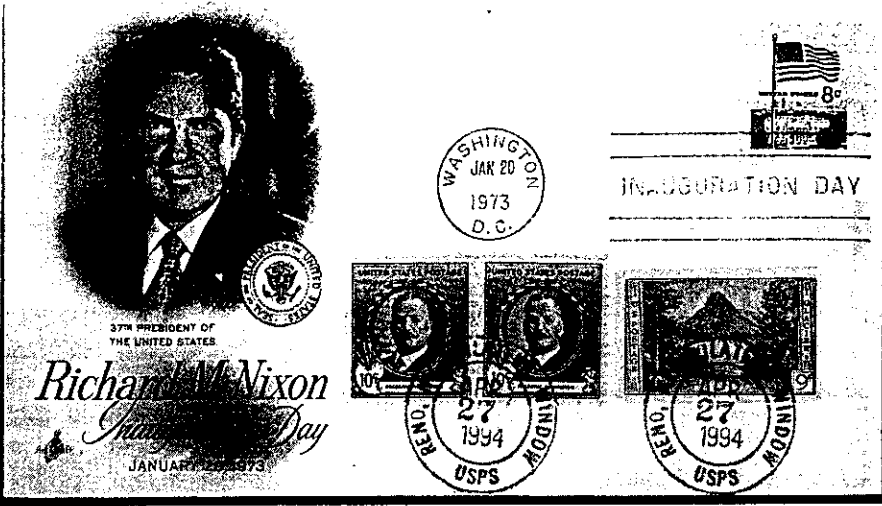
Election of officers will be next meeting. Return your ballots soon.

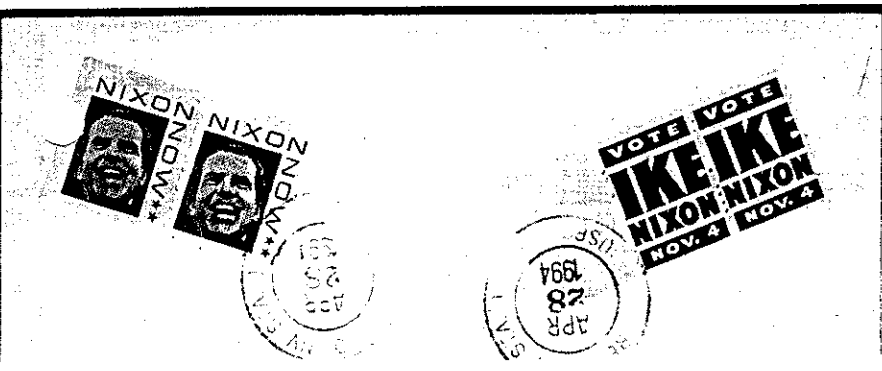


COVER CREATED BY TOM EVENTS
