
## My Favorite "Cover"

I have always attended the Navy League, Reno Council's December 7th, affairs. This group pays tribute to those killed and wounded at Pearl Harbor. Also, to those who fought in World Ward Two.

In 1996, I decided to do a cachet cover for the event. The copy of that cover is shown below.



The cover is signed by Guy Brubaker, the Executive officer of Naval Air Station at Fallon. Richard K Sorenson, Nevada Stamp Club Member, holder of the Medal of Honor, from World War II signed it, also. Other signatures include Ensign Robert E. Thomas, 6th Division, U.S.S. Nevada BB36, who was aboard the ship during the attack. He was awarded the Navy Cross. President John English, and Past Present Don Ten Eych of the Reno Council signatures are on the cover. Chuck Harton, Northern Nevada President Nave League, who went ashore with the Marines at Iwo Jima and survived, signed, also.

The following day, the Reno Arch Cachet was applied by Rick Bansien, U.S.P.S. Dec. 7th, 1996. A day to remember. A dinner and dance to remember and a cover to help remember.
