I came across the stamp identifier issued by the American Philatelic Society. It is an exceptional booklet. It covers all the terminology used by collectors and all the identifying language or marks that are used by every country that issues stamps. At the back are the alphabets of Arabic, Chinese, Greek, Hebrew and Russian. These are the letters and numbers found on the countries that write in those languages. Little helps to identify those unusual stamps.

A Question, worth 100 Auction Bucks:

In what year did **PICTURE** post cards begin and where?

To help clarify the question, these were not the earliest postcards in the United States, but they were the earliest COMMERCIALLY produced picture postcards. The early postcards, pieces of cardboard were as a advertising medium. The first private postal card was copyrighted on Dec. 17, 1861, by J. P Charlton and published by H. L Lipman, both of Philadelphia.

This may require some deep research, but all of you are capable of doing that.


Royal Mail


par avion



Each of the first three days of the show will include at least one special ceremony. Immediately prior to the show's opening the United States will release a pane of 20 stamps commemorating Four Centuries of American Art. Friday morning the Marshall Islands will salute the 200th Anniversary of the United States Navy with a pane of 25 different stamps. And Saturday will be your last chance to obtain the United States first triangle stamps issued to promote Pacific 97. All ceremonies are free and open to the public.

Stamp Saturday

A Beginners' Area for Adults

This outstanding event is for beginning adult collectors (age 15 and up only!). Participants will learn the basics of the hobby and leave with enough knowledge and material to start them on the road to real enjoyment of stamp collecting.

Instructors will explain how to use a catalog, basic tools of the hobby, identification of worldwide stamps, how to mount and store material, and other topics. Hands-on stations will allow practice of techniques, with experienced collectors standing by to demonstrate and advise.

Each participant will receive a bag of materials that includes a stamp packet valued at \$25 catalog, a stock page, some hobby tools, and more.

Two 3-hour sessions will be held: 10:30 am to 1:30 pm, and 1:30 pm to 4:30 pm. Participants must preregister for this program. (Walk-ins will be accepted *only* if space is available.)

Society Meetings and Seminars


