With George Costello at the helm the Junior Stamp Program is moving along very nicely. With the help of Dick Dreiling, Mr. Ho, Jim Ringer and Jerry and Barbara Stanfield, the program is experiencing good growth. The Junior booth at NEVPEX seemed to be busy satisfying the desires of the youth. At this time the program is on summer break, but it will begin again in the September semester.

Frank Fey provided an excellent program on embossed covers. He explained how they can provide a source of errors. Such as, the albino embossed cover. This is a cover which the embossing is visible and felt, but the color is missing. He passed around several examples of this and other embossing errors. He also explained the use of some stamps on older covers, that had their corners cut off, but were canceled as regular postage. Some times the clerk would spot one of these covers and would return it for postage due. Frank., also, passed around some error examples of postal stationary. Very interesting program.


Cindy Scott provided some information about removing the new preglued stamps from covers and other types of paper. It was an article from the Stamp Collector Magazine. It suggested using a naphtha based lighter fluid or cleaner. Soak the cover or paper and then place it between two sheets of glass. Let it remain and very, very, gently remove the stamp. The excess glue can be scraped off very carefully. Hot water can also be used. Soak stamp for 45 minutes and very gently remove the stamp from its backing. She explained the term "cold flow". It means that glue can migrate around to the front of the stamp, either over its perforations or through pin holes in the stamp. This can cause sticking of stamps to the pages of an album. Good information.

A recent article about Capt. Tim Healy, in the June issue of Global Stamp News, brings back my memory of him. I was attending the Avalon Park Grade School, in 1936, in Chicago, when he visited us. He did make a good impression on every one present, including me. That is when I became interested in stamp collecting. I still have the Ivory Stamp Club album. He explained that he became interested in collecting stamps at a doctor's office. It seems that as he and his buddies were hiking through some bushes, his companion in front of him, let fly a branch of the bush. When Capt. Tim reached out to keep it from hitting his face, he ended up, not with the branch, but with the neck of a very poisonous snake. Not knowing how to let it go, his buddy shot it through the head. The resultant burns from the gun shot placed him in the doctor's office. As he was waiting to be treated, he noticed a stamp magazine or a magazine ad for stamps. He became more interested as the doctor, while treating him, provided information about stamp collecting, as he was a collector, himself. This started him on the hobby. Take it for what it is worth, but he did tell some exciting stories in his program. We all sat enthralled. Oh yes, we did buy Ivory soap, which was the whole purpose of the program, in the first place.

In the early days of prospecting and trapping in the Northwest Territories of Canada, communication to the rest of the world was important. This fact caused mail to be a precious commodity. One of the desolate areas is along the Mackensie River. There were 13 villages located along this river. Men on skis, snow shoes or dog sleds carried the mail between Fort Resolution to Aklavik. On the average, mail delivery was once a year. Each village had its own post office, but the mail was delivered from these post offices by locals, or trappers. Some of these side routes were 100 miles long.

Later, snow mobiles or skiddos were used. This method was faster by far. The snow mobile was a later development after the introduction of airplanes.

The mail plane began in December, 1929. The total route was over 1600 miles and it stopped at all villages. Weather, of course, was a big factor in the flights. The flights were made in short hops. A plane would head north and stop at 2 or 3 villages. He would then return to his home field with mail from the north. Another pilot would then ferry the mail to the next 3 or 4 villages. He would then return with mail to his home base. These short flights thus carries the mail from Fort McMurray to Aklavik and back. Just like a relay race.

The cancel was made in 1973 to commemorate Dog Sled Mail. It was carried from the Mission at Colville Lake. It was canceled at Ft. Good Hope, North west Territories.

The cover was flown from Fort McPherson to Fort McMurray.








