

This month's subject will be "Post Cards & Postal Cards." Shown below are several samples of postcards and postal cards. Sometimes it is hard to destinguish between the two.

The first sample is a "Post Card." The "Post Card" is distinguished by its lack of a printed postal value on the card. Usually, a picture or cartoon or some advertising message appears on the face, while a place for a written message and an address is printed on the opposite side.



Here is an example of Postal Card: It has a postal value printed on the face of the card where the address of the receiver is written. On the opposite side there is space to write a message or print an advertisment.



The following Postal Card is called a self addressed Reply Postal Card. The sender can fold the card over, write the address in front and a message on the back side. The receiver can tear the unused part of the card to reply. Since the card has the postage printed upon it the card can be mailed right back.




THIS SIDE OF CARD IS FOR ADDRESS



Here is an example the use of a Post Card as a preset message: A Field Service Post Card. The back side has preset messages which must be selected with an X. The front side is for a written address. No other writing is permitted. Used during WWI.



Another example of the use of a Postal Card is one showing the London Underground railsystem. It can be carried in your pocket and provided all the information needed for one to get around in London.
