The First Flight

When the first flight was only a thought in man's mind, there were those who desired to investigate the theory of flight. They studied the flight of birds and insects and tried to imitate them, but no one could come up with the answer to how birds fly. Some of the earliest ideas were startling and dangerous, to say the least. Flapping their arms and using motorized contraptions did not produce the results they desired.

It took a couple of bicycle repair men to create the idea of flying a heavier than air machine.

Although, there has been some dispute as to the workable idea, the Wright Bros. seems to have the edge on the invention of the airplane. They recognized that wings had to have a slight curve in their structure. This little oversight in previous designs created the necessary lift to raise the plane off the ground. In 1903 the first flight became a reality. It lasted only a few seconds and flew only a short distance of about 150 feet. With success in their hands, Orville and Wilbur Wright continued their development until their plane traveled longer and higher.

In 1936, the U.S.P.O. issued the stamp to commemorate this achievement. SC. # as seen here below. There were several issues by the U.S.P.O. that related to the Wright Brothers achievement. Those stamps are also shown below.
