Over the course of the next three years, the National Archives of Canada at (www.archives.ca) will be working closely with Canada post to create the Virtual Canadian Post Archives. The site will include an integrated search engine and provide wide virtual access to Canada's postal and philatelic heritage. The Virtual Canadian Postal Archives will be officially launched in late August 2001. Regular substantial additions are then planned over the course of the following two years.

New Issues

On June 27 the U.S.P.O. will issue a pane of 20-self adhesive 34 cent stamps picturing 10 of Baseball's Legendary Playing Fields. There are 3 stadiums that still see active duty. Fenway Park, Wrigley Field and Yankee Stadium. With so much baseball going on at this time this would make a good topical subject to collect. There are several baseball players that are honored with stamps in the past. Babe Ruth, Jackie Robinson, Roger Maris and the first World Series. Also, Ty Cobb and Mickey Cochrane. Other countries have honored baseball and their players. Japan, Canada, Mexico, Cuba, Costa Rica, Panama, Nicaragua, Venezuela Colombia and the Dominican Republic. San Marino, Italy and South Korea. So a nice topical collection could be started very easily. The following U.S. issued stamps can give you a start.
