Interested in donating a copy of your exhibit to the library or making it available on the APS [website](#)?

Sharing your exhibit helps new exhibitors improve their exhibits and allows researchers to learn from your work. It also preserves your work for future generations of philatelists.

Donating to the Library - You can either mail us a paper copy of your exhibit, or send us an electronic copy. You can even send both paper and digital versions, which allows the library and our researchers the most flexibility.

Most scanned exhibits are too large to send as [email](#) attachments, so we recommend burning the files to CD-ROM and mailing the disk to us, or using a file sharing service (such as Dropbox [<http://www.dropbox.com>], which is free and comes with step-by-step instructions).

Exhibits Online - We are making select exhibit copies available to members on our website. If you are willing to have your exhibit posted on the APS/APRL website, [print](#) and sign our [license form](#) and send it to us along with your exhibit.

Description: This 8-frame exhibit shows the stamps of the Frederik IX series issued 1948-1960 by Denmark, including the overprints, on First Day Covers. It does not include postal stationery with the same design nor the postal ferry overprints (which were not used on FDCs). In some cases there is rate information. However, many FDCs are overfranked for the service for which they were intended.

The world's first adhesive postage stamps were introduced in the UK in what year?

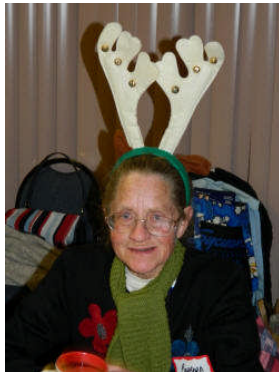
1840. This was preceded by the introduction, on 10 January 1840, of uniform inland letter rates, which replaced the previous, cumbersome system of charging by distance as well as weight. The Penny Black was introduced in May 1840.

One of our longtime members, Rich "Moose" Stachowiak, passed away on December 18, 2013. All of his friends from the casino business knew him as "Moose." At the stamp club meetings he always introduced himself as Rich.

Rich worked in the casino industry for over 30 years before his retirement. Rich was a waiter by profession. He worked at Harolds Club and was an active member of the Harolds Pioneers. He also worked for many years as a Banquet waiter at John Ascuaga's Nugget. He used to raise racing pigeons and loved to go kayaking with his son. His favorite reading material was biographies of famous people.

He was a long-time member of the Nevada Stamp Study Society and attended the meetings regularly. Early in 2013, Rich moved to Las Vegas for the warmer climate. In early fall, Rich was involved in a serious auto accident sustaining a back injury. He was an inpatient at Renown Regional Medical Center for almost 2 months and was scheduled for back surgery before he unexpectedly passed away.
