Duck Stamps by George Ray



I'm sure most of you have read about the fate of the carrier pigeon. During the early 1800's flocks of them would block out the sun for days. James Audubon, the Naturalist, reported one flock took three days to pass. One flock was measured to be 250 miles long. They were considered to be pests and were slaughtered by the thousands, some were used as food, but most were just killed for "SPORT."

Many conservationists felt the same would happen to our ducks and geese, if something wasn't done. With pressure from sportsmen, hunting clubs, and Congress in 1929 President Hoover signed the Migratory Bird Conservation Act to acquire and preserve wetlands for habitat. But due to a lack of money, not much was done. The Dust Bowl and the Depression took a heavy tool on the number of birds. Farmers were draining ponds and wet areas for more land for crops. Flocks of birds were down nationwide.

In 1934 President Roosevelt signed the Migratory Bird Hunting Stamp Act. Congress would not fund money for ducks, so Jay "Ding" Darling, the Director of the Bureau of Biological Survey and Senator Norbeck of South Dakota pulled a fast one and had a 6 million dollar bill attached to another bill. Darling was appointed to head the Duck Stamp Program. He was also a Pulitzer Prize Winning Cartoonist. His pencil drawing of mallards landing on a pond was used for the first stamp issued in August of 1934. The one dollar stamp was to be signed and attached to the hunting license of anyone hunting migratory birds. 635,000 stamps were sold of the first stamp.

In the early 1940's, a contest was started to select the winning stamp design. A group of five judges selected the winning painting. There was a small monetary prize. Boy the biggest bonus comes from the artist selling thousands of larger copies of their winning painting.

Over the years the price of the stamps has grown, along with everything else. In 1934 the stamp was \$1.00, in 1949 - \$2.00, in 1959 - \$3.00, 1972 - \$5.00, 1979 - \$7.50, 1987 - \$10.00, 1989 - \$12.50, and in 1991 the stamps cost \$15.00. Over 500 million dollars has been raised to purchase and save wetlands and habitat.

The efforts of many groups, conservationists, hunting clubs, Congress, and Sportsmen have helped save our other migratory birds from the same fate as our carrier pigeon.
