

The DWI Mystery

I recently read an article by Michael Rogers, a well-known dealer of stamps from China, who now is with a big auction house named Kelleher-Rogers. In the article about his career he stated that his business originally included DWI. I did not know what that abbreviation stood for. I am familiar with the term "Driving While Intoxicated — DWI" but I was pretty sure that was not what he did.

After a couple days of consternation, I decided to phone him. The nice lady who answers at Kelleher Rogers said he was away, but maybe she could help me. I asked her if she know what he meant. She explained she had worked there only a month, and had no idea what DWI stood for, but she would try to find out for me phone me back with her findings. And she did. It refers to a group of islands, formerly colonies of the Netherlands, located in the Caribbean. (Not close at all to China.) The country is NOT listed in Scott Standard Postage Stamp Catalogue ("Scott"). It never issued stamps as such, and no stamps ever appeared with DWI on them. DWI went out of existence in 2010 with the independence of the Dutch West Indies, also known as Netherlands Antilles or Curacao or Dutch Antilles. You can find it in Scott under Netherlands Antilles. Careful to not confuse Dutch West Indies (DWI) with Dutch Indies, now no longer a colony of Netherlands and known as Indonesia. Now you know.

Corrine Glass - Rest in Peace



It is with great sadness that we heard that Paul Glass' wife, Corrine, passed away on Nov. 12, 2015, in St. Paul MN. She was in hospice care since May.

Corrine was very supportive of Paul's favorite hobby. She was always in attendance at the stamp club's social functions, mainly, the summer picnic and the Holiday Party in December.

As her obituary states, she "demonstrated the same grace and dignity she embraced in her wonderful life following a courageous battle with brain cancer."

"Corrine was born on December 3, 1938, in St. Paul, one of six children born to Thomas and Wanda (nee Trojan) Wasielewski. Raised on the East Side of St. Paul,

Corrine attended St. Casimir School and graduated from Our Lady of Peace high school in 1956. After meeting and marrying Air Force Lieutenant Paul Glass in 1961, Corrine traveled the world accompanying her beloved husband of 54 years during and following his 26 years of service to his country. Among duty stations, they lived for 4 years in Japan and 4 years in Germany, and many stateside bases before settling down in Victorville, CA in 1980. Corrine's passions were family, church, travel, gardening, and oil painting. She was a devoted wife, mother, and grandmother, successfully raising her children over many locations worldwide. Always energetic, she was a member of Beta Sigma Phi, a salesperson and district manager for Worldbook-Childcraft, an avid bridge player, a tutor for Victor Valley adult reading programs, and a lector and Eucharistic minister at Holy Innocents Church. She obtained her Bachelors of Arts Degree from California State University San Bernardino, and served as a substitute elementary school teacher in California. Remaining active after retiring with her husband to Spanish Springs, NV, in 2002, Corrine served as a lector, Eucharistic minister, and Senior Hearts group member for Immaculate Conception Church. She also continued to assist in elementary school reading programs, bridge, bowling, volunteering at the Sparks, NV Heritage museum, volunteering at the Pioneer Center for the Performing Arts, Reno, NV, and election board member volunteer for Washoe County. She was also an active member of the Retired Military Officer Wives Club.

"Corrine is survived by her husband, Paul; sons, Larry (Trish) of Omaha, NE, Rick (Margo) of Portland, OR, and Tom (Stephanie) of San Carlos, CA; grandchildren, John Paul, Jared, Wyatt, Austin, and Garrett; sisters, Jeanne Bertram of Vadnais Heights, MN, and Lorraine Wasielewski of St. Cloud, MN; and many nieces, nephews, and friends. Brother-in-law David Glass and sister-in-law Pam Glass provided exceptional care and support throughout her illness. Nieces Mary Christiansen, Cindy Eskandary, Donna Wasielewski, and sister-in-law Donna Bennett also provided loving care and assistance. Corrine was preceded in death by her parents, Tom and Wanda Wasielewski; brother, Jerry Wasielewski; and sisters, Delores Gores and Irene Cherubini.
