PENPEX 2023

PENPEX 2023 was rated a big success by many who attended, including exhibitors, volunteers, dealers, and attendees. Despite two dealers having to cancel at the last minute for health reasons, the bourse was busy, with deals being made at a brisk pace. A popular feature at PENPEX is the Flea Market, held in a separate room from the bourse, where stamps, covers, albums, catalogs, and box lots can be had at bargain prices.

This was the 50th PENPEX show, the first going back to 1951, and annually since 1983. Exhibition Chair Kristin Patterson assembled a dedicated crew to put on this show. Without the help of the volunteers, shows such as this would not be possible.

PENPEX holds a silent auction each year, and this year featured nearly 500 lots! Viewing took place on both Saturday and Sunday, with bidding concluding at2:30 on Sunday. The auction crew was very efficient, and buyers were able to pick up their lots by 4 pm.

This year's exhibits comprised 50 frames, with exhibitors from the Bay Area, Sacramento, Reno, Nevada, and Medford, Oregon. The Grand Prize went to Robert Pope for his "Overprints of Mexico's Hidalgo 5¢ War Issue" exhibit. See the following page for a complete list of awards.

RECC Holiday Party


