
Alameda Stamp Club – The club met on December 11 at Pier 29 Restaurant in Alameda for lunch and installation of new officers.

PENPEX 2025

The annual show held each December in Redwood City was well received by collectors, exhibitors, and dealers. The exhibits were comprised of 34 frames with both multi-frame and single-frame entries. Fifteen competitive exhibits were displayed and a 7-frame court of honor: Hand-Painted, Hand Colored, and Hand-Drawn Covers with Animal Name Postmarks. The Sequoia Stamp Club also offered a frame of "My Favorite Things" from members of the club.

Twelve dealers attended the show, offering a diverse selection of philatelic materials. Sales were brisk, and the Sunday crowd was better than usual this year, with customers making purchases right up to closing time.

Other activities included a flea market that offered bargain prices on albums, collections, covers, and supplies, a silent auction that featured over 500 lots from single stamps to whole collections to catalogs and supplies.

Three box lots of donated items were offered in a raffle that saw 3 happy winners. Each lot included wine, stamps, covers and supplies. Show covers with cachets designed by Sequoia's resident artist Miriam Thurston were on sale throughout the show. Many activities were available to young guests at the youth table, run by Sequoia Stamp Club's youngest member Goyo.

Council Awards and their Criteria

The Chaloner Award

The Chaloner award is the highest honor that the Council bestows. It is given to individuals within the council who have provided significant service to philately over a sustained period. The award winner is chosen by a committee of three comprised of the most recent recipients of the Chaloner Award.

The Holmsten Award

The annual Holmsten award is given to a member of a CNCPS club who displays excellence in exhibiting in support of local stamp shows within the Council area. The Holmsten award is named for the late Leonard Holmsten, a once active exhibitor and tireless advocate for the Council. A local show within the CNCPS area is chosen each year to present the Holmsten award, and the winner's name is added to the perpetual trophy plaque.
